Mayor Davis recommended hiring Jared James at a full-time position for the City at \$10.00 an hour.

Councilmember Shaw moved to hire Jared James for a full-time position at \$10.00 per hour. Motion seconded by Councilmember Hawthorne and carried.

Mayor David recommended accepting proposal from AMIC for liability insurance in the amount of \$109,533.00. This will be a savings of about \$10,000.00 from Travelers Insurance.

Councilmember Shaw moved to accept proposal from AMIC for liability insurance for \$109,533.00 as presented. Motion seconded by Councilmember Armstrong and carried.

Mr. Michael White was recognized from the park board and read the following:

Graysville Park & Recreation Board Questions and Concerns April 2017 Monday, February 13, 2017

- 1. What happened to the money that was received for the Graysville SE park damage from the insurance company during the previous storm? Would like to see money returned to the park
- 2. Floors damaged in the Graysville SE concession stand because windows were broken and not repaired. Would like to see the floors repaired. Also would like to see damaged sheetrock replaced in the concession stand.
- 3. Graysville SE would like to have money reimbursed to the Civic League for repairs after pipe burst in the concession stand where they affected repairs. Would also like to be reimbursed for side walk that was installed by the civic league from the storage building to the pavilion.
- 4. Graysville SE Civic League replaced bulbs and repaired lights on the walking track. They would like to be reimbursed for the cost of the materials,
- 5. There are stumps on the field and near the walking tracks in Graysville Southeast were the old light poles were removed. They are a safety hazard and we would like to see them removed.
- 6. Busted drain pipe in the Graysville SE Park that is a hazard and need to be repaired.
- 7. The light pole knocked down in the Graysville SE still has not been repaired. We would like to see it replaced.
- 8. Cliff Hawthorne has spoken to Mayor Davis and he would have the lock that was put on the timer at Graysville southeast removed since there is not a key for it. There will not be a need for another lock since the timer in inside the locked building there. Cliff will adjust the times according to the summer/winter daylight times.
- 9. The grass is not being cut in the parks. It need to be cut at least at least twice each month. When will this happen?
- 10. The Park Board if there is a liaison from the council to the park board? If so who is it?
- 11. Each Member listed need to know what district they are representing. They want to know which park they are responsible for.
