Councilmember Shaw moved to approve payment of invoices as presented. Motion seconded by Councilmember Hawthorne and carried.

City Comptroller, Tommy Greene, was recognized and he presented financial report through March 31, 2017.

Mayor Davis presented community safe house architect agreements for storm shelters in the Graysville East community and 2nd Street S.W.

Councilmember Lauderdale moved to approve architect agreements for community storm shelters upon legal counsel review. Motion seconded by Councilmember Hawthorne and carried.

Mayor Davis stated he talked to Republic Services in Dora and they agreed to let us dump for \$18.75 a ton vs \$23.50 a ton at our current landfill vendor. Also, Republic Services has also agreed to let Graysville residents dump at a rate of \$5.00 per load with proof of residence.

Councilmember Shaw moved to approve agreement to use Republic Services in Dora for landfill services at \$18.75 a ton. Motion seconded by Councilmember Armstrong and carried.

Mayor Davis gave a brief update on the gas line replacement project.

Mayor Davis presented request to surplus approximately 1900 old gas meters.

Councilmember Teeter moved to surplus approximately 1900 old gas meters. Motion seconded by Councilmember Lauderdale and carried.
