Resolution Number 2022-10 was presented as follows:

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-10
**Resolution Adopting Transportation Plan Pursuant
to the Rebuild Alabama Act**

WHEREAS, the Alabama legislature in Act. No. 2019-2 adopted the Rebuild Alabama Act;

WHEREAS, the Rebuild Alabama Act provides for an allocation among the municipalities of the state on the basis of the ratio of population of each municipality to the total population of all municipalities of the state a portion of the additional taxes levied under the Act to be used for transportation infrastructure, improvement, preservation and maintenance;

WHEREAS, the Act provides that the municipal governing body of the City of Graysville shall adopt an annual Transportation Plan no later than August 31 which shall provide a detailed list of projects for which expenditures are intended to be made in the next fiscal year and shall be based upon an estimate of the revenues anticipated from the fund in which the additional revenue is deposited during the next fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the Act further provides that any such funds shall be used only for the maintenance, improvement, replacement, and construction of roads and bridges maintained by the City of Graysville and such other uses as are defined in the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Graysville as follows:

1. The City Council of the City of Graysville hereby passes this Resolution as its Transportation Plan submitted in compliance with the Rebuild Act, Act No. 2019-2.
2. Pursuant to the Act, the City Council of the City of Graysville estimates that its anticipated allocation from the Rebuild Alabama Act fund for the first fiscal year will be approximately **\$40,561** , with increasing allocations for each fiscal year thereafter.
3. Pursuant to the Act, the City anticipates expending funds received pursuant to the Act, in part or in whole, to fund any of the following listed projects.
 - 3rd Avenue & 1st Street SE
 - 7th Street SE from North Main Street
 - North Main Street
4. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and instructed to post a copy of this Resolution as its Transportation Plan in accordance with law in three (3) public places within the city limits, one of which is the City Hall of the City of Graysville, Alabama.
5. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to establish a separate fund maintained by the City of Graysville for receipt and deposit of funds received pursuant to the Act, the proceeds of which shall be expended solely for the maintenance, improvement, replacement and construction of roads and bridges maintained by the City and such other uses as are authorized by the Act.

Ordinance number 966 was presented as follows:

ORDINANCE NUMBER 966

AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT THE 2021 INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE FOR THE CITY OF GRAYSVILLE.

An Ordinance of the City of Graysville adopting the 2021 edition of the International Fire Code, regulating and governing the safeguarding of life and property from fire and explosion hazards arising from the storage, handling and use of hazardous substances, materials and devices, and from conditions hazardous to life or property in the occupancy of buildings and premises in the City of Graysville; providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefor; amending Ordinance No. 880 of the City of Graysville and all other ordinances or parts of laws in conflict therewith.

The City Council of the City of Graysville does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That a certain document, three (3) copies of which are on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Graysville, being marked and designated in the International Fire Code, 2021 edition as published by the International Code Council, be and is hereby adopted as the Fire Code of the City of Graysville, in the State of Alabama regulating and governing the safeguarding of

life and property from fire and explosion hazards arising from the storage, handling and use of hazardous substances, materials and devices, and from conditions hazardous to life or property in the occupancy of buildings and premises as herein provided; providing penalties, conditions and terms of said Fire Code on file in the office of the City of Graysville are insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 2 of this ordinance.

Section 2. That the following sections are hereby revised:

Section 101.1. Insert: City of Graysville

Section 112.4. Insert: misdemeanor offense \$500.00 and court cost 30 days to correct.

Section 5704.2.9.6.1. Insert: Industrial, Agricultural, B-1 and B-2 zoning districts.

Section 5706.2.4.4. Insert: Industrial, Agricultural, B-1 and B-2 zoning districts.

Section 5708.2. Insert: Industrial, Agricultural, B-1 and B-2 zoning districts.

Section 5806.2. Insert: Industrial, Agricultural, B-1 and B-2 zoning districts.

Section 6104.2. Insert: Industrial, Agricultural, B-1 and B-2 zoning districts.

Section 3. That if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this legislation is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City of Graysville hereby declares that it would have passed this law, and each section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases be declared unconstitutional.

Section 4. That nothing in this legislation or in the Fire Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby amended; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this legislation.

Section 5. That the City Clerk of the City of Graysville is hereby ordered and directed to cause this legislation to be published in accordance with law by posting a copy thereof on the __ day of July, 2022 in three (3) public places within the city limits, one of which was the City Hall of the City of Graysville, Alabama.

Section 6. That this law and the rules, regulations, provisions, requirements, orders and matters established and adopted hereby shall take effect and be in full force and effect five (5) days from and after the date of its final passage and adoption.
