Mayor Davis announced the Graysville Chamber of Commerce is planning a yard sale and car show on May 11, 2019 from 8:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.

Councilmember Teeter announced that his Church 29:11 will be having a city wide Easter egg drop at the Big Ballpark on Saturday April 20, 2019 around 1:00 or 2:00 p.m.

Councilmember Hawthorne stated that Clastran will furnish a van and a driver to transport citizens to and from the Nutrition Center if we have at least 10 people sign up.

Mayor Davis gave a brief update on the Lowe's building and there may be some negotiations worked out soon.

Mr. Terrell who lives on Cherry Avenue reported a vicious dog that chases him and once bit him on the leg. He requested the City Council send the dog owner a letter about the vicious dog ordinance.
