## Resolution Funding City of Graysville Community Park Maurice C. West Community Center

**WHEREAS**, the City of Graysville proposes to construct recreational resources, a pavilion/family group facility, basketball court and one-way road at 350 2<sup>nd</sup> Street S.W. to provide for the health and well-being of the general public; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Graysville intends to make application to the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs for grant assistance to construct a pavilion/family group facility, basketball court and one-way road at 350 2<sup>nd</sup> Street S.W., from the Land and Water Conservation Fund; and

**WHEREAS**, the total proposed project costs total \$136,000.00. The **Applicant** is applying for Land and Water Conservation Fund assistance in the amount of \$68,000.00, or 50% of the total proposed project costs which will be used to construct a pavilion/family group facility, basketball court and one-way road at 350 2<sup>nd</sup> Street S.W.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City of Graysville will hold in reserve \$68,000.00, or 50% of the proposed project costs for the purpose of matching the Land and Water Conservation Fund assistance, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that in the event a grant is awarded, the City of Graysville understands that it will sign assurances to comply with all applicable Federal and State laws, rules and regulations and that the property acquired and/or developed with Land and Water Conservation Fund assistance will be maintained for public outdoor recreation in perpetuity as required by the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965.
